The Future City Competition is in full swing. This year they are back to an in person competition, which will be held on Saturday, January 21, 2023, venue to be determined. 41 schools have already registered!

This year's 2022—2023 Future City challenge is: Choose a climate change impact and design one innovative and futuristic climate change adaptation and one mitigation strategy to keep your residents healthy and safe.

The Future City Competition is a project-based learning program for 6th through 8th grade students around country that introduces them to the principles of engineering while allowing them to use teamwork and creativity to solve problems that face the world. The

program helps advance STEM learning in Middle Schools in our region and encourages students to consider careers in engineering in the future. In recent years the regional competition has grown to include over 500 participating students and teachers in the Philadelphia area, but we are short on volunteer mentors.

LEAN GREEN BELT (\$755 professionals/alumni) Online On-Demand

This three-day course provides an in-depth understanding of lean enterprise principles and how to apply them within your organization. Your lean journey begins with a series of interactive simulations that demonstrate how each lean concept is applied and its impact on the process. Mapping the process flow and identifying the activities that add value from the customer's perspective is the cornerstone of this class. The class is then given a scenario and the students simulate the conversion from traditional to lean in a practical hands-on environment. The course also provides a structure for how to manage a lean process for continuous improvement. Participants will learn how to structure their organizations to support and continuously improve a lean process. Participants will also fully understand how to implement 5S within their plants and how to begin reducing setup time using the SMED process.

SIX SIGMA YELLOW BELT (\$380 professionals/alumni) Online On-Demand

Demystify this topic with this seminar that includes a discussion of the Define-Measure-Analyze-Improve-Implement-Control (DMAIIC) methodology. This seminar will provide you with an overview of the basic philosophy, organization and methodology for Six Sigma quality and introduce you to the Six Sigma topics of variation, process capability and root cause analysis. The exam is included in the course fee. Participants who pass the exam receive IISE's Six Sigma Yellow Belt Certification. Participants will need to complete suggested readings and work practice problems in addition to viewing the online presentations as they prepare to successfully complete the certification requirements.
