IISE HQ Changing Chapter Relationships



Chapter President Kevin Drevik attended an online meeting of IISE leaders where it was communicated that the portion of membership dues that have been earmarked for local chapters will no longer be distributed. Financial pressures, exasperated by covid social rules have resulted in the elimination of these chapter distributions. The IISE model of raising income through training and seminars/conferences had been generally successful until the resulting cancellations and change in social norms associated with covid.

The announcement came as a surprise to the many chapters attending the meeting and was light on details resulting in several open questions regarding options considered and financial details. IISE HQ's main takeaway is the expectation that all chapter become financially self-sufficient. HQ's plan calls for the treatment of all chapters alike; regardless of activity and to closer align professional and university chapters. The SJDV Chapter board discussed the decision at the last board meeting and is finalizing a response for IISE HQ consideration.

Many of the advantages often cited for IISE membership include aspects of local chapters. These include networking, mentoring, and professional & social association. Chapters provide the opportunity for developing leadership skills and a local network. Chapters focus on promoting the profession at the local level. We have a long history of visiting local schools, assisting STEM competitions and providing financial support to local universities and school activities.

IEs are no strangers to change; it in our professional blood line. Industrial Engineering, Industrial & Systems Engineering, Integrated Systems Engineering and other versions of nomenclature that describes us (and future versions) needs to be embraced. Industrial Engineering is ever changing and growing and as we need to adjust to new technologies; we need to adjust to new social realities. IISE "burned" through its emergency funds and, according to a conference call back in May, was not back "in the black" for 2023 – though they said they were close with increased attendance at training and conference events. The decision was made at corporate, to try to preserve funds for cash flow purposes, and so they have chosen to eliminate the membership fees that they were sending back to the local professional chapters. As you can expect, this has put a "hole" in our local chapter budget, and the board is looking into ways to address this.

I will have more info as the year progresses and we move ahead with our program year. In the meantime, I hope everyone is having a great summer and looking forward to the fall programs!
